Plumbing	Reconfigure waste plumbing - gym restrooms Currently unable to solely use the gym bathrooms during large events as it promotes sewer back-up.	X	
Storage	Only storage space in basement - Not easily accessible for short-term use by staff. (Look to add storage on existing pad)	Cafeteria could become file storage	
Playground Surface	Blacktop cracking and large areas need repair. Playground is not completely enclosed. Safety concerns for student flight risks and unexpected guests.	Х	
Playground Equipment	Installed - 2001. Moved - 2012. Currently, we are addressing sharp edges, rust, and parts replacement	х	
Exterior Safety	Bus loop doesn't separate buses from moving children with curb or other barrier.	х
