
Excellence applies to all aspects of life, including personal relationships, career, hobbies, and self-care. It embraces change, and lives in a balanced mind, body, and spirit.

Award: \$500

Presentation to the recipient follows the completion of their first semester. The distribution requires verification of completion of their first semester, and a fee receipt for the second semester.

- 1. What is one thing that you want me to know about you that no one has asked that will better help me understand your dream?
 - 2. What significant family experience(s) have impacted your future goals?
 - 3. With four years of high school experience under your belt, is there anything that you wish you had known on day one that may have changed your decisions, choices, or actions over the past four years?
 - 4. Are there any historical figures, personal heroes / role models (from the past or present) who have inspired you, for which you would like to interview? Why?
 - 5. If your passion and discipline are in the artistic arena, please submit three of your creations, ones that you love (even if they are not your best). If any explanations are needed, please include.
 - 6. Essay: Imagine your life has been a long meaningful journey, and now you're reflecting on the legacy that you are leaving behind. Picture yourself at 95, surrounded by loved ones who celebrate all that you have accomplished and the impact that you made. Ask them to read the *eulogy* that you have written for yourself, that captures how you want to be remembered---- your passions, contributions, and the essence of who you are. (400 words maximum)
