Academics:

Reading/language arts- Unit 2 is all about animal classification. Both the student reader and read aloud are non-fiction pieces.

One goal we have in this unit is to be able to identify text features in our non-fiction text and to be able to tell how they help us. The text features we are working with are: table of contents, glossary, bolded words, photos & captions, maps, diagrams, headings, labels and charts. Please ask your child to tell you where the table of contents and the glossary can be found in a nonfiction book and how they are used. Table of contents are at the very beginning of the book and help us find chapters quickly. The glossary is at the back of the book. It's like a mini dictionary. These words are the bolded words in our readings.

We are learning that animals are classified into vertebrates or invertebrates. We are focusing on the vertebrate category. We know there are 5 groups within that category: Amphibians Mammals Birds Fish Reptiles (All My Best Friends Represent Vertebrates)

We also know that vertebrates can be classified into two more categories: warm blooded vertebrates and cold blooded vertebrates. Which one are we?

Now we are learning the characteristics of each individual vertebrate category. So much science learning is happening.

We had been reviewing nouns, verbs and adjectives. Now we have added subject, predicate, conjunctions and compound sentences to the list. We will be analyzing sentences all year. Ask your child to tell you what the function of a conjunction is and give an example. Conjunctions hook up words, phrases and clauses-(Remember the old Schoolhouse Rock videos? They're still a great teaching tool!) We use the acronym FANBOYS to help us remember For And Nor But Or Yet So


Spelling- We are learning rules to help us know what to do before we add -ed and -ing endings. If a word ends with a


silent e, drop the e before you add suffixes that start with vowels, otherwise you keep it. (smiled, smiling, smiley).

Math- We are almost halfway through Unit 2 on multiplication. The students are quickly learning that multiplication is just repeated addition and that skip counting can help us. We are working on finding the most efficient ways to solve our multiplication problems.

Any chance you can, while driving down the road, making supper or other down time, quiz your child on basic multiplication facts.

Number Corner- To finish out the month of October, we learned what





the word congruent means. It means shapes that have the same size sides and same size angles but might be flipped or turned. We found 4 pairs from our month that were congruent.

We finished collecting our liters/milliliters of liquid. We collect a total of 5L or 5,000ml.
