Academics:

Forward testing coming up-

Please check with your child to see if their headphones are still working. A number of the students have broken headphones or ones that occasionally don't work for them (making crackling noises, etc.). We use headphones every day during WIN, but they will definitely need them for the upcoming testing.

Remember that we will be taking some practice tests next week and then taking the actual test April 10, 14-17. Try to avoid scheduling appointments on those mornings.

During testing week, I would like to give students a little snack to start their morning off right. Some ideas I was thinking about would be: mini muffins, cheese sticks, some sort of bread (banana for example) or fruit like grapes. Just a little something for each morning would be great. I will send a google sign up if you would like to help.

To help us focus while we are testing, we are also looking for suckers and/or gum. Dum Dums and sticks of gum vs. bubble gum work best.

Reading/language arts- We are back to another science unit. Unit 5 is all about light and sound. We just finished learning about light and how it travels. Now we are beginning to learn about sounds. Did you know that light travels 850 times faster than sounds? Also, light travels much faster in the vacuum of space, but sound cannot travel in that same vacuum.

Ask your child to tell you how fast light travels in a vacuum? 860,000 miles per second What medium (solid, liquid or gas) does sound travel through faster? Solid-because it needs particles in order to vibrate which in turn creates the sound.

We continue to learn more suffixes. (-ous and -ly) We are also working on writing sentences with more detail adding adjectives and adverbs.

Spelling- Our new set of words focus on 3 of the 7 sounds we know the long a makes. The -ay- can alway be found at the end of a word or syllable. The -ai- is found in the middle of a word or syllable. When they hear a consonant sound at the end of the word or syllable, they should spell it with -ai. -ea does not occur very often.



Math- Our focus on Unit 5 is the relationship between multiplication and division. We again are trying to find efficient strategies to help us solve both types of problems. We've been playing a number of games to help us practice our facts.

On days your child doesn't have homework, besides going onto Dreambox or xtramath, you could play one of the games we've been learning with your child. The games can be found in Clever. Go to "My Page" then go to "Work Places". You need to be in slideshow mode, but once there, pick Unit 5 and the game you want your child to play.

Number Corner- We are starting a new calendar for April. This month for the calendar grid observation. We are looking at fractions and parts of a whole.

We will also be continuing to work on multiplication facts, even taking timed tests to work on our speed. Solving problems and working with a number line will also be skills we'll continue working on.
