#### Academics:

Reading- We read a short story called "What Do Illustrators Do?" The story compared two illustrators and how they would recreate Jack and the Beanstalk. Students learned that illustrators create a dummy to lay out their plan. They also have to decide what perspective they would use: bird's eye view, far away, close-up or even a mouse's point of

view. Did you know that most picture books have 32 pages? Ask your child: Why would an illustrator need to use a mirror to help them when they draw? (To have a model to see an expression like surprise.)

Math- In unit 2, our goal is to use efficient strategies to solve one digit by one digit multiplication problems accurately. One strategy we've been trying is doubling: if your problem is  $8\times3$  = m you can take  $4\times3$  = 12 and then double the 12 to get 24.

We wrapped up our October Number Corner with a Number Corner assessment. We will be sharing those at conferences.

For the month of November N.C. we will be collecting fractions  $(\frac{1}{2} \frac{1}{4})$  and finding the area of a variety of shapes.

Language arts- For this week's DLR, we learned about abstract and concrete nouns, what a pronoun refers to, how to capitalize a title correctly, and when to add -s or -es to make a word plural. Ask your child: How do you know when to add -s or -es? (If the word ends in a hissing sound or like air is coming out of a tire. Ex.) words that end in s, ch, sh, and x)

We are wrapping up our first round of personal narrative writing. Next, we will work on writing opinion pieces. What better time of year to convince their parents to buy them a present they want? They will need to be convincing.:)

Spelling- This week we learned tricks to help us remember three priority word homophones:

\*there (place) \*their-(ownership)I own something \*they're (they are contraction) we also need to know where

Social Studies- We started our study of landforms (physical features) beginning with oceans and rivers.

Science- This week we took a quiz on animal behaviors. We know many, but not all animals live in groups to help protect each other, get food and keep each other warm and safe.
