Academics:

Reading/language arts- We are over $\frac{1}{2}$ way through Unit 4: The Ancient Roman Civilization. The last few weeks our focus has been on Julius Caesar. We have been learning key points about him and working on filling out graphic organizers to compare similar stories about him.

Ask your child to tell you a few things they have been learning about either Julius Caesar or Augustus/Octavian Caesar.

Spelling- We took our test on the long e words- spelled with ee or e on Wednesday. On Thursday the next set of words were sent home in your child's homework folder. Please keep them in a safe place to practice.

Math- We wrapped up Unit 4 with a partner project. The students started out by drawing and designing a beanstalk that was approximately 36 inches tall and had at least 20 various sized leaves. Next, the students needed to measure the height of their beanstalk to the nearest $\frac{1}{2}$ inch and then measure each of the leaves to the nearest $\frac{1}{4}$ inch. Finally, we collected data from our measurements and created line plot graphs. We knew we were successful if we could work as a team, measure accurately to the $\frac{1}{4}$ inch and accurately plot the data. Next week we will take our end of the unit assessment.

Number Corner- For the month of February's calendar, we are working on finding the area and perimeter every day. The color pattern follows the colors of the rainbow while the dimensions follow a pattern as well (1x1, 1x2, 1x3, 2x2, 2x3, 2x4, 3x3, ect.)

We are also working on collecting fractions of a dollar. First, we collected 1/10ths (dimes) followed by $\frac{1}{3}$ s (\$0.25), then finally $\frac{1}{2}$ (\$0.50).

The last thing in number corners we are working on is multiplication strategies for 2's, 3's and 4's.
