Here's What We Learned

Literacy: Our new words this week were where and red. We identified beginning sounds in words, practiced sight word songs, identified ending sounds, and listened for rhyming words.

Math: We did lots of adding and subtracting this week. We played Top-It with numbers to 20. The children loved this and you can play at home as well It's the same game as Warl We used pattern block stencils to make pictures and patterns, and worked on counting on from numbers other than I. Science: This week we began our first exploration of weather! Your child heard a story about a little boy who watched storms with his grandpa from the front porch of his house. The little boy learned how exciting it can be to watch the weather! After hearing the story, we observed and drew the weather. Science Student Link
