

Here's What We Learned

Literacy: Our new sight words were yellow and make. We read more books and talked about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and why we celebrate him. We had fun reading The Crayon Box that Talked and we talked about how each one of us is unique and special. We thought of rhyming words, blended sounds into words, identified individual sounds in words, and changed the beginning letter in a word to make new words.

Handwriting: We have been working on writing words and sentences using the lowercase letters we've learned how to write correctly. We learned how to correctly write letters p, r and n. We worked on writing the letters on white boards before practicing in our workbooks.

Math: We started measuring using our feet and talked about why we were coming up with different numbers depending o whose feet we used. We counted by ones with the calculators, learned about attribute blocks and played a fun game based on the attributes of the block we chose, and worked on number recognition by playing a game and identifying numbers based on clues about the number.

Literacy and Math Camps: We started our camps back up this week! All of the children are currently going to the same camp they had been going to before Christmas. We are in the process of reviewing data to determine the best fit for each child and expect to make some changes in the next three weeks. Camp time is an amazing way to give children extra time to practice skills with other children who need the

same practice. For some children this is work on sight words and letter sounds. For some children this is an opportunity to work on enrichment activities. What a great way to get to know some different children and make

new friends!

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
