

## Here's What we Learned

Literacy: Our new sight words were on and they. We read lots of Dr. Seuss books and had great discussions about the stories. The children did a lot of writing to answer questions about the stories. They practiced retelling and identified the beginning, middle, and end of the story. Math: We played some familiar dice games and added a new game that required counting the dots on THREE dicel We

are learning how to count on. We played coin games and have been reading stories and singing songs to help us learn the coin names and their values. Solid (3—dimensional) shapes were introduced this week.

Writer's Workshop: The children are listening to examples of small moments stories and are trying to pick just a small moment in time to write about in more detail.

STEM: Today the challenge was to see how high each group could stack the Cat in the Hat's hats! The hats were plastic cups and the children tried first with just the cups and were then given squares of paper to use if they wanted to.
