Art Nouveau Slab Container with Pressed Design

To begin drawing your slab container, think of different shapes. Draw 1 slab container idea for each.



CONSTRUCTING YOUR SLAB CONTAINER

You will be making a geometric shaped container out of slabs. The slabs will be pressed with your stamp which has already been created and fired.

- 1. Wedge some stoneware and roll out slabs for your stamp(s), using the thickest sticks & a rolling pin.
- 2. Cut out the shape of your stamps, according to your design.
- 3. Let your stamp dry briefly to become leather hard. Do not use needle tools, but instead use trimming tools and/or wooden tools. Remember that what you carve away, will stick out on your container. Any words will have to be carved backwards!
- 4. Set out on shelves until bone dry.
- 5. Sand with green scotch pad LIGHTLY and have them bisque fired.
- 6. While you wait for your stamps to be fired, roll out several slabs using sticks and a rolling pin.
- 7. Cut out all of the slabs you need for your project, including the bottom. Make sure to hold your needle tool at a 90 degree angle when cutting them out, so the sides are straight.
- 8. While the clay is still soft and sides are not joined, press your stamp into the clay.
- 9. Allow your slabs to become leatherhard before attempting to score and slip them together.
- 10. Slip and score and put your pieces together.
- 11. Add a thin coil of clay to the inside corners and smooth in, to make the joints stronger.
- 12. Smooth edges and do touchups.
- 13. If you have a lid, add a lip or flange, so it cannot slide off.
- 14. Let dry upside down and very slowly or the joints will crack. Sand gently with green scotch pad.
- 15. Bisque fire
- 16. Glaze 2-3 coats. Art Nouveau colors range from naturals to pastels.
- 17. Glaze fire.
- 18. Apply overglaze if necessary and fire again.
